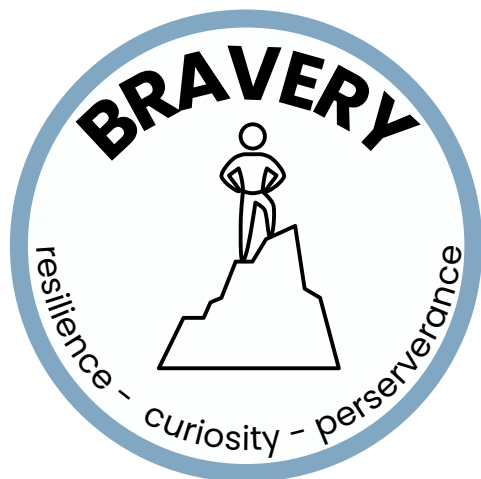
We hope everyone enjoys a safe and restful long weekend.
