OUR THREE PILLARS

LITERACY

Our Junior Primary teachers have started the year analysing data collected around our students' phonemic awareness. Phonemic awareness is the ability to hear and manipulate parts of words including compound words, syllables and individual sounds. We have noticed great improvement in our students' phonemic awareness this year and have set short-term goals for each class. In order to achieve these goals, some students will be involved in targeted small group work within the classroom, and some will work on targeted intervention with an SSO.



HINTS FOR HOME

One of the earliest phonemic awareness skills is recognising and producing rhyme. Make it a game with your child while driving to school - 'I spy with my little eye a car, that rhymes with jar'



HINTS FOR HOME

Encourage your child to consider multiple ways of solving a problem, ask 'Is there another way to solve that?'

NUMERACY

This year our teachers are again working with Mathematics consultant Mike Chatres to further develop their knowledge and skills around the effective teaching of Mathematics. This year our teachers are focusing on developing learners that can 'think mathematically'. This is a skill that will support students to notice pattens and connections as well as thinking flexibly around finding solutions to problems.

WELLBEING

As a school we have prioritised building relationships for the beginning of 2024. We know that building strong relationships between students, teachers, peers and families are the foundation for impactful learning. When students feel connected to school and their teacher they have a greater sense of wellbeing and are able to engage with meaningful learning. Teachers have greatly appreciated families returning the parent perspective forms as these have provided them with invaluable information and insight into their students.

If you have not yet returned the parent perspective form we encourage you to do so.

CHINESE NEW YEAR

In Art this term, Room 9 have been learning about the Chinese New Year and the twelve animals of the Chinese Zodiac. They have learnt that this is the year of the Wood Dragon. They have also learnt what animal they all are depending on when they were born, learning about the traits and characteristics of each animal. They had fun making dragon kites, masks and the Zodiac Wheel. Room 9 was also lucky enough to have a Chinese pre-service teacher who was here with us last year teach them a Chinese song wishing everyone a happy new year.

WHAT IS SCHOOL CARD?



School Card provides financial help to cover the cost of school fees.

WHO CAN APPLY?

To qualify for School Card, your family's income must be below a specific limit. This limit depends on how many children are in your care.

You must also meet at least one of the following:

- have a child or children aged four years or over who attend a school full time
- be an independent full-time student studying year 10, 11 or 12
- be an adult re-entry student undertaking subjects to complete SACE (years 11 and 12).

HOW WILL I KNOW IF I AM APPROVED?

After you apply, you will receive a letter in the mail advising if your application has been approved. Please note, School Card is not a student identification card.

All types of School Card applications are now online.

You can access the online forms from any device that gets internet, including mobile devices, such as tablets and smart phones, as well as laptops and computers.

Applying online is easy! Simply follow the steps below.

- STEP 1 Visit sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard
- STEP 2 Select the type of School Card you would like to apply for (for example 'Type A') and follow the prompts.
- STEP 3 Complete all mandatory fields.

Please note: you cannot submit your application unless all mandatory fields are complete.

- STEP 4 Once you have completed a page click on the 'NEXT' button.
- STEP 5 Once you have filled out all pages click the 'SUBMIT' button.

Please note: If you exit the form without clicking "SUBMIT" your details will be lost.

You can save the form, and return to complete it at another time, by clicking on the 'SAVE' button.
